NUT FREE SCHOOL

We are a nut free school.

There are children across all age groups with allergies to many foods.

STAFF CAR PARK

The car park is for staff use only,

Parents are not allowed to use the staff car park at any time.

Parents must use the parent car park before the school gates.

PARENTS CAR PARK

Please be patient and mindful of other car park users at drop off and pick up times.

The car park does get busy so observations and patience is important.

Please do not park on double yellow lines/junction box/outside people's driveways on St. Thomas Close.

Meet the teacher

Parents/carers are invited to our annual 'meet the teacher' evening on the 18th September.

The evening will begin in the school hall where Mrs. Rawlinson will introduce the evening and give a talk before parents go off to visit classrooms with their child's class teachers. Each talk in the classrooms will be repeated for parents to visit more than one class.

Meet the teacher evening gives parents an opportunity to hear about the curriculum and look at teaching and learning resources and see your child's new classroom.

Teachers will explain what you need to know and their expectations regarding homework, reading, PE, RSHE, extra curricular activities and how you as parents can help support your child through this next academic year, working in partnership with the school.

The evening will begin at 3.30 in the hall.

Talk two in classrooms 4.20—4.30pm.

EYFS phonics workshop

Parents and carers of children in nursery and reception classes are invited to a phonics workshop on 25th September in the school hall at 3.30pm.

EYFS staff will be explaining exactly how we teach reading in school.

They will give demonstrations and show the online resources that can be accessed at home.

They will also explain the procedures for reading and reading at home.

Reading is the key to future success and has high priority in the school. We hope you can join us.

Changes in the law regarding term time absence from school
