## Results of parental questionnaire

Many thanks to the 43 parents who completed the survey sent out last week.

Some questions required a longer text answer which gave a deeper insight into areas of safeguarding, individual learning needs, and any further comments about your experiences as parents. The overwhelming majority of these responses were incredibly positive. Thank you.
